As the new academic year starts, the pandemic remains with us and guidance and protocols remain necessary in order to keep all stakeholders safe. Please take a few moments to read this updated guidance.

Please show a negative PCR test taken within 48 hours on your first attendance on the campus, this is applicable every start of each semester according to current Covid-19 restrictions as per the Ministry of Education – UAE.

Accessing SBS Centre in Dubai Knowledge Park

We require that all students/staff/visitors upon entry to the centre follow the instructions as below:

- Must display your Al Hosn app with a green pass*
- Check your temperature – must be 37.5 degrees or less
- Sanitise your hands
- Wear a face mask
- Maintain distance of at least 1m
- Sign a declaration of health status form

If any one of these criteria cannot be satisfied, you will not be permitted entry.

*Please check al hosn for the current green pass requirements.

Once in the centre, we require that you respect others and maintain a distance of at least 1m from others at all times. Do not share equipment and sanitise your hands regularly, and keep your face mask on.

Our Health & Safety officers monitor behaviour in the centre to ensure compliance.

There is signage throughout the centre to remind users of physical distancing, no hand shaking, hand washing, sanitising, mask wearing, and cough/sneeze etiquette.



Should you experience any symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough, fever, body aches, runny nose, fatigue, shortness of breath, sore throat, diarrhea, headache please **do not come to the Centre** and follow the DHA protocols <https://www.dha.gov.ae/en/Covid19/Pages/Coronavirus.aspx>

Suspected COVID-19 Case

If you or someone around you is experiencing symptoms such as a fever of over 37.5 Celsius, cough, body ache or fatigue, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, diarrhea, nausea, headache, loss of sense of taste or smell, while on campus, you are obliged to notify the Health & Safety Officer in the SBS UAE Centre.

We will then take the necessary further actions.

The HSO will ask you to leave the Centre and seek medical attention and take a PCR test. If you are too unwell to do this, you will be escorted to the isolation room to wait for the ambulance to arrive.

You are required to isolate for 48 hours until your PCR test result is known. Please notify the HSO immediately of the test result.



Positive COVID-19 Case

If a positive case of COVID-19 is confirmed, contact tracing investigation will be initiated by the HSO working with the DHA.

It is important that you co-operate with the HSO to help identify close contacts and enable the tracing process.

Distance learning can be requested for any student testing positive or a close contact until such time as the HSO agrees they can return to campus as per the protocols.
